## **NH Flying Tigers RC Club – Monthly Meeting Minutes February 28, 2024**

President Paul Pazolt called the meeting to order at 7:02. There were 11 members and 4 officers present.

**1. Secretary's Report** – In lieu of a secretary report, the minutes as published in the newsletter were accepted unanimously by the members.

**2. Treasurer's Report** – Pat Clark presented the treasurer's report. We currently have 45 members. Treasury looks fine for our annual budget. A full copy of the report can be acquired by any member by contacting one of the officers.

### **3. President's Comments, Training Coordinator & Field Marshal's Reports -**

No training Report this month as its still winter. However, it looks like an early start to the season if the weather holds out.

Field Marshal Report: The beaver dam has been rebuilt! The ditch is doing its job and is flowing nicely. The Mud Lock is going on this week. As previously discussed, it was agreed that we should get new combination locks as the old ones are rusted and stick. It was voted on that Mike Miller would acquire 3 new locks for the gates and the container. The combination will be changed with the installation of new locks.

Pat Clark is working on a design for a pipe to go under the Beaver dam.

**4. New Members** – Victor Ibrahim, a prospective member, attended the meeting. Fellow members answered his questions and assisted with his application.

**5. Old Business** – Rob Roy has created a prototype for the new sign. Rob has shared these prototypes with the membership and one was selected. John Lavery will build a wooden frame to hold the sign which Paul Lockwood is having printed. Frame costs will be \$200-\$300. The sign will be protected by Lexan.

The new flagpole was voted on and approved unanimously.

Paul Pazolt will check with the AMA to see what the regulations are concerning the posting of rules.

The Plane Assembly table was discussed again. There appears to be a need for such an assembly space when preparing larger planes for flight. The trend is towards larger aircraft so it is probably something we will need more and more.

Tom made and shared some individual prototypes of small plaques that could be mounted on a larger frame. The idea was well received. Tom will have more input for the March meeting. Thanks Tom for taking the lead on this project.

Paul Pazolt presented a video featuring a collage of past and present members and aircraft. Thanks, Paul.

Mike Miller announced that he had started a plan archive. Mike has collected plans from members, visitors and the public to put together this wonderful asset. There is a catalog of plans that has been developed which he will email to the membership.

There being no further business, the members voted to adjourn at 7:42.
